While all students are required to wear proper base, mid, and outer layers, the only specific items that are required are marked as such.

LAYERING BASICS:

- 1 base layer
- 2 mid layer
- 3 outer layer

1 BASE LAYERS

Purpose: Regulate body temperature and wick moisture

Ideal Clothing Materials: Wool, merino, polyester

Necessary Clothing Items:

- 1. Base Layer Shirt
- 2. Base Layer Pants
- 3. Socks (not cotton)











2 MID LAYERS





Ideal Clothing Materials: Fleece, merino, polyester



- 1. Mid Layer Shirt
- 2. Mid Layer Pants













3 OUTER LAYERS

Purpose: Windproof, waterproof

Necessary Clothing Items:

- 1. Insulated hooded jacket
- 2. Reima Waterproof Rain Pants (Required)
- 3. Reima Waterproof Rain Jacket (Required)











4 ACCESSORIES

Purpose: Keep ears, fingers, and toes warm

Necessary Clothing Items:

- 1. Warm hat or balaclava
- 2. Waterproof mittens
- 3. Bogs Classic Boots (Required)

CENERAL TIPS

- Please make sure your child is not wearing any cotton. Cotton absorbs moisture and stops insulating, which will leave your child feeling cold.
- Winter clothing (boots included) should be loose fitting so that the body's natural layer
 of insulating warm air can surround the skin. Rain gear should be roomy enough to fit
 over all other layers.
- The only specific items that are required are:
 - 1. Reima Waterproof Rain Jacket & Pants (any color)
 - 2. Bogs Classic Boots (any color)
- We know children grow fast and quality clothing can be expensive. Our hope is that over the summer and early fall, you are able to bargain hunt, find these items second hand, or consider purchasing new and passing on to others when your child grows.
